50% OF WOMEN IN CANADA HAVE EXPERIENCED AT LEAST ONE INCIDENT OF PHYSICAL OR SEXUAL VIOLENCE BY THE AGE OF 16

67% OF ALL CANADIANS SAY THEY PERSONALLY KNOW AT LEAST ONE WOMAN WHO HAS BEEN SEXUALLY OR PHYSICALLY ASSAULTED

85% OF VICTIMS OF SPOUSAL HOMICIDE ARE WOMEN (EVERY SIX DAYS A WOMAN IN CANADA IS KILLED BY HER INTIMATE PARTNER)

WOMEN ARE TURNED AWAY FROM OVER-FULL SHELTERS EVERY NIGHT (3,300 WOMEN WITH THEIR 3,000 CHILDREN NIGHTLY SLEEP IN SHELTERS TO ESCAPE DOMESTIC VIOLENCE)

THE RED ZONE

The first month and a half of post-secondary education is the time when women are most likely to be raped or experience attempted rape. This time period is known as the "Red Zone"—a period of vulnerability for sexual assaults, beginning when newcomers first walk onto campus until Thanksgiving break.
